ABEA— Providing the Bridge Between Business & Education: Today's Students Becoming Tomorrow's Leaders

FOCUS ON THE FUTURE

“Districts facing teacher crunch” so begins the lead story in today’s Arizona Republic. It continues, “High rates of retirement, turnover, student growth leave schools scrambling for qualified educators.” Of particular importance to ABEA is the fact that we, as always, are in need of fresh blood in our organization. The article goes on to state that there aren’t enough teachers coming into teaching to meet the demands in the local community.

This situation will only be exacerbated as the number of teachers retiring continues to increase. Not only that, more teachers quit in their first five years of teaching than at any other time, primarily because of their frustration with state mandated testing, district competencies, parent intervention, and student disciplinary problems. Finally, with the continued growth of the Valley, the gaps in teacher openings and the people to fill those openings will continue to widen. School districts are losing teachers to retirement and resignations faster than they can fill the vacancies.

There are an estimated 1,500 potential teachers graduating this year and

half of them won’t be in the teaching profession within five years. Some even say that for things to remain the status quo there must be at least a 50% increase in the number of teachers graduating. The system can’t merely produce students only to watch them leave in such a short time span. More must be done to keep these teachers intact and comfortable in their environment and in the career they have chosen.

With the advent of No Child Left Behind and the key provisions that all teachers must be “highly qualified” to teach, the situation becomes obviously more tenuous. Eugene Garcia, President of the College of Education at ASU, goes on to say that the key to preventing overcrowded classrooms directed by underqualified teachers from becoming a reality in the near future is to lure more professionals into the classroom with post-baccalaureate certification and *to provide mentoring and induction programs that give new teachers something to latch on to when they consider walking out the school doors for good* (emphasis added).

Anyone with a vested interest in our educational system, such as us, must



take notice of this situation and understand how it affects us. We must be that mentoring and induction program. We must be that vision that teachers need in order to survive in the classroom. We must address this issue and determine the best way to approach this dilemma and set up a methodology that allows us to provide mentoring to new teachers. We need to find a way to reach those teachers that want to be reached, who are new, who feel lost, and who have no alternative to turn to at their schools. That should be the future for us: Mentoring and Induction. The new teachers need us, the students need us and the entire educational community needs us as well. We have a reason to exist and we should promote this idea as we get closer to our conference for next year.

Tom Horne Announces a Summer Administration of the AIMS Test

Arizona Schools Chief Tom Horne announced today the Arizona Department of Education will be administering the AIMS test over the summer, limited to seniors who meet local requirements to graduate, but still need to pass one or more AIMS tests.

“The Department is trying to ensure that every student in the 2006 graduating class has another opportunity to pass the AIMS test this summer,” said Superintendent Tom Horne.

The Department will be administering the test in July: Writing, Tuesday, July 11; Reading, Wednesday, July 12; and Math, Thursday, July 13. The test will be given in several locations around the state: Phoenix, Tucson, Flagstaff, Yuma and possibly other locations to be determined, including northwest and northeast Arizona. The individual schools will be responsible for identifying those students who have met all graduation requirements except passing one or more parts of the AIMS test. “The summer administration will enable students to have a diploma in hand before beginning post secondary school and career opportunities,” concluded Horne.

ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM THE BOARD MEETING INCLUDE NBEA CONVENTION 2006

The convention will be held April 12-15, 2006, at the Tampa Marriott Waterside Hotel and Marina, the Hyatt Regency, and the Tampa Convention Center. Most conference meetings and activities will be held at the Convention Center, next to the Marriott and a couple of blocks from the Hyatt. Both hotels are excellent; however an advantage to the Hyatt is that the rooms are less expensive and attendees will receive a 3-day pass for local transportation. There are two areas within an easy tram ride for many eating choices.

Convention concurrent session topics are varied and pertain to all levels of education.

The on-line convention registration process will be available at www.nbea.org.

The convention program will be available on NBEA Online. As new information becomes available, it will be included on the website.

Two (2) NBEA professional development stipends are available to WBITE members for 1st time attendees to the NBEA Convention. The application can be found in the current issue of the Business Education Forum

BOARD ACTIONS:

Membership emphasis placed on accountability of regional and state membership directors;

Full-time students, pursuing initial licensure/certification, and enrolled as a full-time student in business education, shall be eligible for student membership. College and university professors "sign off" on a student membership application. STP and regional membership directors need to be aware of the student membership requirements and the form

A Convention Task Force was formed in March, 2005, to study the NBEA Convention structure timing, length of the convention, locations, etc. The recommendation of the Task Force is that the annual NBEA Convention continue to be held the four days immediately prior to Easter. Hotel rates and other costs, associated with the convention hotel contract, are more favorable to the association and convention registration fees than any other week of the year.

Structured English Immersion Requirement

Discussion/ confusion about the requirement for teachers to have the Structured English Immersion Education Endorsement on their teaching certificates continues.

The requirement statement is *"From and after August 31, 2006 a Structured English Immersion Endorsement, English as a Second Language Endorsement, or Bilingual Endorsement is required of all classroom teachers, Supervisors, Principals and Superintendents."* All coursework must be on the Arizona English Acquisition Services (EAS) SEI Approval List.

As you may or may not know, ASSET offers a 15-Hour online course entitled: Provisional Structured English Immersion (SEI) Endorsement: An Introduction to SIOPR. This course, which is approved by the State Board of Education* to meet the 15-Hour Provisional Endorsement requirement has been extremely popular. Sections often fill very quickly.

In an effort to meet the great demand for this professional development experience ASSET has recently trained more online facilitators for this course. This cadre of qualified and experienced educators will allow ASSET to almost

triple the number of sections offered on a regular basis.

ASSET opens new sections of the course, Provisional Structured English Immersion (SEI) Endorsement: An Introduction to SIOPR, for registration on the first Wednesday of each month.
